Strathcona Wilderness Institute is hosting a one-day Mycology Workshop on Saturday, September 21, 9:00 am till 5:00 pm, in the Strathcona Park Wilderness Centre located at the Paradise Meadows trailhead in Strathcona Park. The SPWC is adjacent to the Raven Lodge on Mt. Washington, home of the largest Vancouver Island marmot population. For interested participants, the workshop is complemented with an <u>optional</u> one- day hike into the spectacular old–growth Divers Lake area on Sunday, September 22 (9 am to 4 pm).

The workshop consists of basic and advanced presentations on mushroom ecology, morphology and identification by some of Vancouver Island's best-known mycologists, followed by two hands-on short field trips into Paradise Meadows (and towards Battleship and Helen MacKenzie Lakes.)
